Over the past twenty-five years, she has shouldered the burden of impacting the local education system, earning tenure status during her time with the Lansing School District while also holding the positions as Assistant Adjunct Professor of Mathematics, Educational Consultant, and College Connect Program Coordinator+ at LCC. Dawn was recently named the Director of the Maya Angelou Training center within Lansing Community College in addition to her appointment to the President's Strategic Task Force.

As Director, Dawn has transformed her team into a synergized group, each demonstrating growth in a variety of areas. Under Dawn's leadership her dynamic team has completed over seventeen trainings, workshops, and Community Outreach events in just eight months. All were created to not only increase the participants awareness, but also ignite the critical thinking mind within in them. Additionally, Dawn has established collaboration opportunities beyond LCC with both local and international community partners and other Higher Education Institutions.
